Subject: COVID-19 Response Mechanism additional funding for the Republic of Kazakhstan

Your Excellency Minister Tsoi

The COVID-19 pandemic is rapidly spreading across the globe and threatens to derail HIV, TB, and malaria programs, overwhelm community and health systems and cause significant morbidity and mortality. To mitigate the impact of the pandemic on the three diseases and support health and community systems in the Republic of Kazakhstan, the Global Fund has approved **USD 898,172** of additional investments for your country's COVID-19 response, under the Global Fund COVID-19 Response Mechanism (C19RM).

Please note that this is a one-time investment additional to your country's 2017-2019 allocation (and where necessary, the 2020-2022 allocation) and will become part of grant KAZ-T-NCTP.

The interventions, activities and investment amounts approved by the Global Fund are set out in Annex 1 of this letter. Annex 1 also includes the conditions associated with access to the additional funding and/or implementation of these interventions and activities which have been identified at this stage and must be met by the timelines identified.

These interventions and activities were identified for immediate award due to programmatic need. Given the urgency of these interventions and activities, the funds should be incorporated into the grant no later than 8 October 2020.

Set out below are the next steps required to enable swift implementation of the approved interventions and activities.

- By 27 August 2020, the Principal Recipient is requested to finalize with the Global Fund, the remaining order details (e.g. delivery address and incoterm) for procuring the COVID-19 diagnostics products under Wambo as well as a breakdown of COVID-19 diagnostic orders per grant.
- 2. By 27 August 2020, the Principal Recipient is requested to finalize with the Global Fund, a breakdown of the approved C19RM funding, activities and health products by completing and/or updating the Supplementary Information Template sent to the Principal Recipient on 4 August 2020. The funding breakdown should preferably be at quarterly and cost-input level to facilitate revision of the Detailed Budget.

3. By 10 September 2020, the Principal Recipient is requested to finalize with the Global Fund, a revised Detailed Budget capturing all approved C19RM interventions and activities within the budget template's COVID-19 module and interventions. Revisions to the Detailed Budget are expected to follow standard requirements as set out in the Global Fund Guidelines for Grant Budgeting (2019, as amended from time to time).

The Global Fund Country Team will issue an Implementation Letter upon receipt of the above items to the satisfaction of the Global Fund. In order to avoid delays in programming the additional funds, the Principal Recipient is requested to return the countersigned Implementation Letter by email as soon as possible and in any event, no later than 15 days from the date the letter is sent. Failure to do so may result in the funds being reinvested elsewhere by the Global Fund.

The additional funds must be used by **30 June 2021** and only for the purposes for which the funding was approved and pursuant to the terms and conditions of the Grant Agreement.

Please note that C19RM support and grant flexibilities for the COVID-19 response cannot exceed an amount equivalent to 10% of the country allocation for the 2020-2022 allocation period.

Your Global Fund Portfolio Manager will be in touch shortly to advise further on the above process. We stand ready to support the Republic of Kazakhstan in responding to the COVID-19 pandemic, which threatens to destroy years of progress against HIV, TB and malaria. To defeat COVID-19, protect progress against HIV, TB and malaria, and save lives, we must unite to fight.

For the avoidance of doubt, the process of procurement of up to 2,700 Cepheid tests indicated above has been initiated and is currently being processed.
